Coaching Education Providers To Apply for Accreditation

The National Council for Accreditation for Coaching Education (NCACE) is pleased to announce two new coaching education providers, the University of North Greenville, and the Boston Coaches Academy have joined NCACE's Registry. By joining NCACE's Registry, these organizations have indicated their intent of submitting their coaching education programs for accreditation review to NCACE. They join the current Registry members including Emporia State University, the School District of Philadelphia, USA Football, Train 'Em Up Academy, and the Institute for Rowing Leadership.

Coaching education providers who join NCACE's Registry receive free training and application assistance for three years while they prepare to apply for accreditation.
